Christine Kovic, Associate Professor of Anthropology at the University of Houston-Clear Lake, has conducted research in the areas of human rights for the past twenty years. She is author of Mayan Voices for Human Rights: Displaced Catholics in Highland Chiapas (University of Texas Press), Women of Chiapas: Making History in Times of Struggle and Hope (co-editor with Christine Eber, Routledge), and a series of articles and book chapters. Her current research addresses the intersection of human rights and immigration, with emphasis on Central American migrants crossing Mexico, migrant deaths at the U.S.-Mexico border, missing and unidentified migrants in South Texas, and on the organizing efforts of Latina/os in the United States. Kovic is the recent recipient of the University of Houston President's Research Fellowship Award for her academic scholarship, a Houston Peace and Justice Center award for work to document migrant deaths in South Texas, and an earlier Rockefeller Residential Fellowship from the University of Florida for the program "Religion in the Americas."
